




In writing, we have continued drawing pictures and having a go at writing sentences to match




In Reading, we have been doing an author study of Mem Fox!

## READING

We have been focusing on Sarah L. Thompson books in our Author's Study. Students have been exposed to four books by Ms Thompson which have been visually stimulating while also learning about features that authors use including figurative language.

## WRITING

We have been learning about the Author's Craft and ways we can use these skills to improve our writing. These include figurative language, incorporating exciting vocabulary and re reading what has been written so that students can make improvements based upon their needs.



## MATHEMATICS

We have been focusing on measurement and geometry. Students have learnt about shapes and how to find the area and perimeter of regular and irregular shapes. Students have used their mathematical reasoning to do this which includes multiplication and division strategies.



## TOPICAL STUDIES

The Grade 4s have continued learning about how various cultures are unique, including Australian, Aboriginal and others that students have shared about. We also learnt about accepting others' cultures when discussing Harmony Day. We will culminate learning about cultures by having the students create a project showing what they've learnt.

## Tutor Learning Initiative - TLI

In TLI (Tutor Learning Initiative) this term, Grade 3 and Grade 5 students have worked with either Mrs Greenough, Mrs Davies or Mrs Kadic as part of a small group. These small groups have focused on Literacy or Numeracy in order to support students with continued academic growth. Students participated in 3 or 4 45minute sessions a week.

In Numeracy sessions, teachers worked with students to enhance their mathematical skills and strategies. This was done through the use of concrete materials, problem solving and games.

In Writing sessions, students composed, revised and edited their own work to further develop their writing skills. These sessions focused on developing a particular writing skill for each student.

In Reading sessions, teachers worked with students to further develop their comprehension of texts, improve their fluency and build upon their strategies for decoding unfamiliar words.


